ROBERT M OBERHOLSER CELEBRATES

Our Robert celebrated his 99th birthday Sept. 18th with his family and the center of attention was not the honored guest, but his 8 month old great grandaughter, Jessica! Robert wrote that she had already captured the hearts of her grandparents and her great grandfather. He reported that his vegetable garden was filled with peppers, eggplant, cabbage, brussel sprouts, beans, beets, carrots, sweet potatoes, etc.

THE FAMILY OF I SAMUEL OBERHOLTZER, IMMIGRANT 1727

II JACOB OBERHOLTZER OF MANHEIM LANCASTER CO PA Jacob Oberholtzer's first wife Catherine died and he married 2 Catharine Bear, widow of Martin Bear. Catherine was born c1758 and Jacob was probably born around 1730. In his will written in 1803, Jacob said "agreeable to a certain contract in writing made and entered into by and between her and me previous to and in consideration of our marriage." Catherine's 1st husband had died 1795 and she was left with 4 children. She died in 1833 and is buried in Mouk Cemetery, E Hempfield Twn Lancaster Co. Catharine Oberholtzer d/o II Jacob by his first marriage, married Michael Ober and their daughter Ann married Henry Bear s/o the second wife of II Jacob. That means that Ann Ober married her mother's step brother!

III CHRISTIAN OBERHOLTZER S/O II MARTIN OF LANCASTER CO PA In the Grantor Index, Lancaster Co, there were 11 Christian Oberholtzers listed before 1800 so I decided to check them out. The first 10 deeds were for Christian Oberholtzer of Hempfield Twn who was not related to I Samuel. The 11th deed was most interesting because it gives information never found before. It is a deed dated 1/9/1796 which states that Christian Overholser and his wife Ann, late Ann Wenger wido of Michael Wenger of Earl Twn received a sum of money from her late husband's estate. I then consulted The Wenger Book, Samuel Wenger, and found that Michael Wenger had married the third time to Anna Sarah Landis. Christian Oberholtzer's 1st wife was Mary Hoover and she is said to have died ca 1800. Now we know that she died between 10/11/1795 when she gave birth to her daughter Magdalena and 1/9/1796. This would mean that Christian's son John born 12/28/1797 is the s/o Ann and not Mary, as noted in previous lineages. Christian and Ann moved to Lebanon Co.

The Pennsylvania Mennonite Heritage has had two very interesting articles recently. In the April 1990 issue there was an article SWISS ORIGINS OF GROFF, HESS, WEBER, LANDIS AND OBERHOLTZER FAMILIES by Jane Evans Best which Will Overholtzer calls an excellent article. The author examines the Swiss origins of some of the people who attended an illegal meeting in Steinsfurt, Germany in 1661, among them Marx Oberholtzer, and their possible relationships to families who lived in Lancaster Co, PA. The other article was in the October 1990 issue titled THE GROWTH AND DECLINE OF MENNONITES NEAR SCOTTDALE, PENNA.: 1790-1890 by Levi Miller. This article would be of special interest to the descendents of Henry Overholt (1739-1813) who went from Bucks Co PA to Westmoreland Co PA in 1800 with his family.
