After lunch, those present will introduce themselves and then we will go outside to have the Reunion picture taken by Chuck Carroll.


A brief business meeting will follow, presided over by President Chuck Carroll with reports by the secretary, necrologist, treasurer and the book committee.

JACOB OBERHOLTZER OF BRECKNOCK, LANCASTER CO PA

Karen Zach has found her Oberholtzer family for a dime! She had purchased an old copy of the Pennsylvania Mennonite Heritage for that dime over 3 years ago and finally got around to looking at it last year. There was Jerry Stahly's article on Jacob Oberholtzer 1704-1755 and her search was over. Her ancestor is Veronica (Franey) Oberholtzer c1775-1842, d/o Samuel & Eve (Hauswirth) Oberholtzer of Shenandoah Co VA. Franey married John Darst c1772-1860. Helen Turn's book gave very little information on this family so we are delighted to have Karen's family added to Samuel's line. JOHN OVERHOLSER C1764-1842 MONTGOMERY CO OHIO ORIGINALLY FROM SOMERSET CO PA

Last September, Bruce McCrea of Lansing MI wrote asking about the parents of Susannah Overholser 1798-1880 who married Jacob Martin 1797-1871. In a library, he had seen the article "The Terre Hill Oberholtzer Family" by J Spencer Overholser in the Pennslyvania Mennonite Heritage 4/1978 and wrote to the Lancaster Mennonite Historical Society for the present address for the Association. After I told him they were John & Susanna, he made trips to Ohio to check out court records and the results are that the family of John has been changed with some children deleted or added and he found that the maiden name of John's wife is possibly Snider/Snyder. He even found the approximate death date of Susanna.

Susanna Overholser's maiden name was suspected to be Stutzman but Bruce found that there is a possibility that she may be the d/o Jacob and Margaret Snyder who had property in Frederick Co MD and Bedford Co PA.(1) We can only hope some documentation will turn up that will help solve this puzzle. In checking the probate records of John Overholser (d 1842), Bruce found that the executors of his estate paid 3/15/1850 "five dollars and 50c in full for makin the coffin for Susannah Overholser Dec 9". Therefore, Susannah died early December 1849. Susanna is said to have been born c1775 which would make her 12 at her first son's birth. In reviewing the 1830 & 1840 census, it has been determined that she was born c1769/1770. The burial place for John and Susannah has not been found.

For many years the lineage of John Overholser recorded 13 children but we find that Samuel Overholser who married Susannah Earhart and Henry Overholser who married Mary McCormick are from other lines. Absalom c1804-c1840, another recorded son, is also taken off the list. Bruce copied the will of John Overholser and part of it read "the lawful heirs of my son Abraham dec'd".(2) The abstractor had misread the name Abraham.

Also on the list of children was Barbara b c1796 who in 1814 had a child by David Brumbaugh.(3) It is said that she probably never married. This was another Barbara as John's Barbara 1807-1882 lived with her parents until their deaths and in 1857 married Philip Filbrun 1797-1873 (his 2nd wife). This is proved by the estate papers of John Overholser, Barbara's will (4) and the book "A Fillbrunn Family History".(5) She is buried next to her brother Jacob and his wife Catherine in Bethel Cem, Randolph Twp, Montgomery Co OH.

From the estate papers, another daughter has been added. Catharine Overholser 4/20/1796-1856 married Jacob Shover 1783-1863. There is a mistake in her birthdate on her tombstone because in the 1850 census she was 57 and her sister Margaret was born 10/4/1795. Catharine should be placed before Margaret on the family list of children.

Margaret Overholser is on the list of children as having married Joseph Waggoman. Bruce met with Don Bowman of Brook-

ville OH and found the name should read Wagner. Her dates are 1795-1847 and his 1779/80-1855.

In the settlement of John Overholser's estate, there were 25 heirs (children and deceased childrens' heirs) who have all been identified, thanks to Bruce. The vendue sale for the estate was held 3/8/1850 and it brought \$32.21. Of interest-a rocking cradle sold for \$.05, a large Bible \$.50, a large Bible \$1.00, clock & case \$3.55 (grandfathers clock), spinning wheel \$.55, doughtray \$.05 and 2 beds & bedding \$3.05.

We have tried to tie in John Overholser (d 1842) with Abraham Overholser c1740?-1798 Bedford Co PA. They both were living in Woodberry Twp, Bedford Co 1789 and Abraham is said to have left a will (it hasn't been located) naming 4 children, one of whom was Susanna b c1762 who married John Snyder, s/or Jacob and Margaret Snyder who might be the parents of John Overholser's wife Susanna. The other two children of Abraham have been identified as Jacob Overholser c1770-1795 married Susannah Ulrich and Mary Overholser c1773-1845 married David Stutzman. All information we have points to Abraham Overholser as the father of John but the final proof lies in finding the will. We have just learned that the will of John Snyder, husband of Susanna Overholser, was found in a file drawer in Bedford Co many years after it was probated in 1793 and finally recorded in Will Book 21. Don Bowman told Bruce that he saw the will of Abraham Overholser which was translated from German to English but he doesn't have a copy.

Jacob & Susannah (Overholser) Martin donated part of their land to the county for a cemetery and in 1866 they sold about two acres plus the buildings on the land to the German Baptist Church for \$5. This land is now Oakland Cemetery and Oakland Church of the Brethren where many of the family are buried.

We are <u>very</u> grateful to Bruce for his fine research which completed the family of John and Susanna Overholser.

Robert M Oberholser, our oldest member, died 4/1/1994 at age 102. He will be remembered as a kind gentleman and for his loyal interest in the Association, having served as treasurer, editor and necrologist. He never missed a Reunion and at 101 attended last August. He was a lifelong educatorteacher, principal and for 37 years Superintendent of Schools, Bordertown NJ. In retirement, he was active in many areas. His interest in his family history resulted in a 85 page booklet "The Salisbury Township Oberholsers". He also did booklets on his Baldwin and Haines lines. An avid gardener, each year he would send me a long list of vegetables in his garden. His wife, Grace Johnson, died in 1975. He is survived by daughter Elizabeth Frey, son-in-law Herbert Frey, grandsons Robert and John Frey and great grandchildren Jessica Elizabeth and Steven John. The Association sent a contribution in his memory to the Ardena Baptist Church.

MARCUS OBERHOLTZER C1664-1726 CHESTER CO PA Martin Overholt & Esther Fretz children

Barbara Overholt married Mathias Burchfield, Mary Overholt married Christian Noffzinger and Abraham Overholt married Susan Crites. They were early pioneers of Dover Twp Tuscarawas Co Ohio prior to 1813. One winter they lost 11 members of their families from typhoid fever.

JACOB OBERHOLTZER OF BRECKNOCK, LANCASTER CO PA REV SAMUEL PETER OVERHOLTZ 1845-1927

HEAD QUARTERS CAVALRY MIDDLE MILITARY DIVISION OFFICE PROVOST MARSHAL, WINCHESTER VA 4/19/1865

I, Samuel P Overholtz private of Co K, 7th VA Cavalry C. S. Army, do hereby give this my parole of Honor, that I will not take up arms against the US Government until I am regularly exchanged. And that if I am permitted to remain at my home I will conduct myself as a good and peaceable citizen and will respect the laws in force where I reside, and will do nothing to the detriment of, or in opposition to the US Government. Signed Samuel P Overholtz, age 19, height 5'10", fair complexion, brown hair, blue eyes.

Sworn and subscribed before me this 19 day of April 1865 Simon Snyder, Capt Provost Marshal

(Samuel P Overholtz enlisted 12/31/1863 in Timberville VA for 3 years in the 7th Virginia Calvalry (Confederate). He was on the list of prisoners of war which were paroled in Winchester VA)

FROM ARLENE MARTIN, MISHAWAKA IN

Walkerton Indiana Independent 10/29/1898
Mt Vernon, Indiana-Mr & Mrs Chris Overholser from
Chambersburg PA visited with the latter's brother Samuel
Wenger and family a short time since. Mr Wenger and his
sister had not met for 30 years.

April 13,1901 Walkerton Married by the Rev Good, April 4th, Wesley Bradley to Mrs Amanda Overholtz. They have purchased the home of Eli Miller near Blissville and will soon go to housekeeping.

July 1, 1905
M H Broughton, assistant train master of the Baltimore & Ohio R R at Newark, Ohio has purchased the lease and furniture of the Ross house in Garrett, of George Oberholtzer and has assumed possession.
