#### WHAT HAPPENED TO MARIA OBERHOLTZER?

Maria Oberholtzer (MC73) born 12/19/1740 Bucks Co PA was the d/o Martin Oberholtzer (MC7) and Agnes Kolb. After her father died, her mother married William Nash who bequeathed various household items to "my daughter Maria" in 1760. Stanley W Nash of Vancouver Canada became curious as to what had happened to Maria and when THE OBERHOLTZER BOOK came out, he wondered if this was the Maria Oberholser (MS) who married 3/16/1764 Wilhelm Springer. The marriage was performed by the minister of the New Hanover Luthern Church, Montgomery Co PA. Stanley Nash found that William Springer bought land in Towamencin Twp, Montgomery Co in 1764, having lived before that in Gwynedd Twp. The land was sold in 1774 and they moved back to Gwynedd. The 4 oldest children of William Nash by his 1st and 2nd wives lived in Towamencin Twp. Was Maria Springer living near her step sisters and step brother? I found the will of William Springer which was proved 12/1/1791 and he names his wife Mary and children John, Jacob, Daniel, Henry, Joseph, William and Barbara. His executors were friends Henry Kassel Jr, Jacob Kulp and Peter Kulp. More research is needed to find out more about this Springer family. Was Maria Springer the d/o Martin Oberholtzer?

#### A MUSICAL NOTEBOOK

In the Mennonite Historians of Eastern Pennsylvania (MHEP) Newsletter March 1995, there was an interesting recent acquisition. On Indefinite Loan from the Bally Mennonite Church, Berks Co PA, is an 1810 Notenbuch (Musical Notebook) of Henrich Oberholtzer used in Rockingham Co VA. The book was on the pulpit of the Old Bally Mennonite Church for as far back as anyone remembers. It was believed that Henrich Oberholtzer was probably from the Old Oberholtzer family (JB) of the Bally-Hereford area. Records show that there was no Henrich in that time period in this family.

In a copy of one of the pages, Springfield Township is written. I believe the book belonged to Henry D Overholtzer (AS4) who had lived in Springfield Township, Bucks Co, before his marriage to Mary Bechtel of Colebrookdale, Berks Co. Mary's parents, Isaac and Esther Bechtel are buried in Old Bally Mennonite Cemetery. Henry and Mary Overholtzer moved to Lancaster Co ca 1819 and possibly left the book with her family when they moved.

#### NEW INFORMATION

Henry Oberholtzer of Summitville IN sent a picture of a tombstone to Spencer Overholser which was taken in Brimfield, Peoria Co IL. This was not Henry's line (SL) but I found that it gave us new information on another line. It was the tombstone of Henry Oberholtzer (JCld), the 14th child of Jacob Oberholtzer (JC), Mennonite minister of Columbiana Co OH.

#### ANOTHER UPDATE

Bruce McCrea of Lansing MI continues to find more information on John Overholser c1764-1842 Montgomery Co OH (JM). On a recent visit to Bedford Co PA, he located the will of Abraham Overholser (AB) of Woodberry Twp. which names his children John, Maria, Jacob and Susanna w/o John Schneider. This proves that John Overholser (JM) is the s/o Abraham. The inventory for his estate was taken 1791 but the will wasn't submitted for probate until 11/23/1793.

About 1755, a colony of German Baptist Brethren settled in Morrison Cove, Bedford Co. The first minister in this area was Abraham Overholser.

In the Border Cemetery, Waterside, Bedford Co, there are two stones-one A.O. 1791 and the other M.O. 1795. They are believed to be the graves of Abraham and his wife although her name in estate papers is Catharine.
