In the February 1998 Bulletin, there was an article AN OLD-FASHIONED BARN RAZING. More was written in the Mennonite Weekly Review 11/25/1999 about Dean Leatherman and his determination to move the bank barn from Bucks Co PA to Hesston KS. The barn was built back in the 1790's by Jacob Overholt, Dean's ancestor, in the community of Pipersville, Bucks Co. A CANADIAN DETECTIVE CONTINUED FROM AUGUST 1999 BULLETIN

Deborah Gilbert of Thunder Bay, Ontario has studied the sons of Isaac Oberholtzer (HJ14), who went to Canada from Hatfield, Montgomery Co PA, in her search for the parents of Abigail Oberholtzer, born in the area of Waterloo, Ontario Canada, who married William Stauffer.

In the August BULLETIN, two of the brothers, Henry and Joseph, were mentioned. A third brother was John Oberholtzer (HJ142) who we thought seemed the likely father of Abigail. This John had married Abigail Yeakle who died 8/1/1825 and they named two of their sons Noah and Reuben which were two of the names of Abigail O Stauffer's sons. After Abigail died, John threatened to take the children to Canada in a dispute over her estate. After the court appointed a guardian for the children, we know they stayed in the Hatfield area. John disappeared from the Hatfield Twp tax record in 1827 and we thought he had gone to Canada, remarried and named a daughter after his first wife. In Waterloo, Canada, there was a John Oberholtzer who said in Naturalization papers that he came to Canada in 1821, the same year as Henry (HJ143). That couldn't be Brother John because he was in Hatfield at that time. Who was the John that came to Waterloo in 1821? How is he related to the Hatfield Oberholtzers? The answer will be in the August 2000 BULLETIN. Deborah deserves to wear the detective badge because she is such a thorough investigator.

QUERIES

Seeking the parents of Harry O Overholser, born c1888 in Ohio as were his parents. He married Katharine Moos and their son was my father Donald Eugene Overholser 4/20/1919-3/2/1986 Lebanon IN who married 9/5/1939 Helen L Eggers. In the 1920 census, the family was living in Pike Twp, Marion Co IN.

UPDATE

At the Reunion, we decided to spend up to \$600 from the Book Fund to have the 53 page "Das alte Oberholz und die Familie Oberholzer" translated from German to English thinking that it would give us important early history of the Oberholtzers and possibly identify the families of immigrants. Kathern Maine said she knew someone who might help with the translation for a fee. In the meantime, Spencer and Ruth Overholser found that they had been given a copy of the book in 1977 by Rosy Oberholzer of Oberholz, Switzerland. Ruth did a rough translation and found that there is some early Oberholtzer history but after several pages, it follows one family that has no connection to any of the Oberholtzer immigrants. It is felt that we should not put that kind of money in something that does not give us the information that we hoped for.
