May any of you folks be interested in a tour of one or more Overholser farms some year? There is alot of work involved, so we invite your input.



She had contacted the OFA about 9 years ago and I didn't have any luck in finding her great grandparents although I had found a Harry Overholser in the 1900 census in Montgomery Co OH who I suspected was the one I was looking for. He was a step son of John Eby but I had no further information. I found Judi Stucky on a message board and she was trying to find where Harry and his wife Katharine were buried. Harry's parents were George Oscar Overholser 1866-1894 and Sallie Urick. I didn't assume that the middle initial "O" in Harry's name was for his mother's maiden name and as it turned out, it was probably "O" for Oscar.

LOST AND FOUND

The Internet has message boards for posting queries and I scan them for Oberholtzers, Overholsers, etc. I saw one by John Seymour of Santa Barbara CA who was trying to find information on Samuel T Oberholtzer who had married 5/21/1872 Betty Jane Jordan in Knox Co IL. He said Samuel died between 1874 and 1878 in Illinois or Nebraska because Betty Jane married again Thomas McCoy. I remembered a picture of a tombstone that Henry Oberholtzer of Summitville IN had taken and sent to Spencer Overholser who sent it to me. There on the tombstone was "Samuel T Oberholtzer died July 31,1873 aged 26 yrs.10 mo.12 ds." He was buried with his parents. John Seymour was thrilled to finally solve the mystery of Samuel T. He had wondered if he died, left his wife or had his wife left him. If Henry Oberholtzer hadn't taken the picture, there is a good chance that the case of Samuel T wouldn't be solved. This family belongs to Jacob Oberholtzer of Northampton Co PA and Columbiana Co OH [JC]. See THE OBERHOLTZER BOOK ADDITIONS/CORRECTIONS page 4 this issue.

Another query was easy to solve. Neil Keever of Saratoga CA was trying to find something about his grandfather Cornelius Overholser who married c1910-1912 Sarah Leota Hallowell in Dayton Ohio. He knew Cornelius had a brother Enos and a sister or sister-in-law Pearl. I knew Cornelius and his twin brother Enos and that Pearl was a sister-in-law. Cornelius had a first marriage that produced a son Heber that Neil didn't know about, in fact Neil's mother has known very little about her father Cornelius or his family because she was only 3 when he died. Now he is trying to locate the family of Heber Overholser, his mother's half brother. When he died in 1965, his obitutary said his children were Mrs Hubert Houdeshell of New Paris OH, Donald of West Manchester OH, Charles of Homestead FL and Martin of Greenville OH. I was able to put Neil in touch with a second cousin Betty Venables of Haines AK who is a member of the OFA. This family belongs to John Overholser of Adams Co PA [JA]. Raymond Smith of Bloomington IN wrote asking for help with his wife's Overhulse family. He could only give me the names Forest, Glen and U.S.Grant with no dates and that the descendants now live in Wood Co OH. Some years ago I used to go into the National Archives Branch in Philadelphia to record the census for many States. I had recorded the 1880 through 1920 for the Oberholtzers, Overholsers, etc. in Ohio so I was able to locate the family. If their names had been John, Jacob or Henry, I would have had a hard time locating them. The family belongs to Jacob Oberholtzer of Brecknock, Lancaster Co PA [JL].

I found another man who had the year 1909? birth for his father Donald Overholser and he thought he died in the 1960's. Thanks to Kate Stirk who sent me batches of the Social Security Death Index, I found that his father was actually born 4/17/1914 and died 1/1967 Grand Junction CO. This should help him obtain a death certificate which hopefully will give him further information.

Have you noticed that there are more men tracing their families now?

WHO IS SUSANNA SCHEULER?

Have you ever wondered how the wrong information gets into the records? About 20 years ago, the OFA received a family chart for a Jacob Oberholtzer, a widower born 1704, who came on the SAMUEL in 1732 with his two children Elizabeth and Samuel. This should be Jacob of Brecknock (JL). It said he married the second time Susanna Scheuler (1) and that their children were Barbara S Oberholzer who married Christian Bretz (2), Jacob S Oberholtzer 1741-1811 (3) who married Esther Bleam 1741-1811, Esther S Oberholtzer 1743-1816 (4) and Henry S Oberholtzer 1745-1783 (5) married to Catherine Shumaker 1748-1823. It continues with the family of Jacob of Berks Co.

- (1) The adminstration papers of the estate of this Jacob Oberholtzer show his wife as Barbara.
- (2) In checking the dates of Christian and Barbara, I find that his last name was Fretz, not Bretz and that Barbara, minus the "S", is the d/o Martin Oberholtzer 1709-1744 Bucks Co (MC7). I even had this couple in the ODDS AND ENDS page of the book as Bretz!.
- (3) This Jacob, minus the "S", is the first known of the Berks Co PA line.[JB]. He married Esther Bliem 1741-1816
- (4) Confused with the wife of Jacob Oberholtzer. There was no Esther Oberholtzer in this line.
- (5) Henry, minus the "S", is the s/o Jacob Oberholtzer and Deborah Krey of Franconia, Montgomery Co and is [JF14].

As you can see, the only true fact is that Jacob Oberholtzer, born 1704, came on the ship SAMUEL in 1732 with his two children Elizabeth and Samuel.

Susanna Scheuler appears to be very popular because I just discovered in the LDS records that she is listed as the wife of Jacob Oberholtzer 1704-1759 and that she was said to have been born c1715 in Berks Co and that they married 1736 in Berks Co. This Jacob, according to the record, is the s/o Jacob Oberholtzer and Deborah Krey. If this "marriage" took place in 1736, the first 4 children listed would have been born out of wedlock. They are listed as having the middle name Halteman, not Scheuler and two of the other children listed are from the Berks Co family.

Another LDS record shows Jacob Oberholtzer born 1704 Montgomery Co PA married Susanna Scheuler in 1725 Palatinate...Switzerland.

What brought this all to mind is a query on the GenForum Message Board with mention of the marriage of a Jacob Oberholtzer and Susanna Scheuler. I wrote to the person saying that I was the genealogist for the Overholser Family Association and compiler of THE OBERHOLTZER BOOK and that there was no such marriage. The answer I got was "Can you tell me what line of Oberholtzer you do have? I am curious to see what you do know". I answered with a list of Oberholtzers in the book table of contents and I have never received a reply!

Someone has placed a family group in the LDS records with the marriage of Jacob Oberholtzer and Susanna Scheuler and that is why people have accepted it as fact. LDS has a **Please Note: Since the information in Ancestral File is contributed, it is the responsibility of those who use the file to verify its accuracy.** Has anyone ever taken the time to verify the accuracy of these records? Unfortunately, many people take the LDS records as fact, as they do all printed words. Researching a family tree takes time and plenty of patience and I believe that alot of people try to avoid that! Bruce Coffey of Freeport, Maine sent me an article about DNA used on dozens of men who had the same surname. Brian Sykes, an expert in genetics at Britain's Oxford University, tested men with the name Sykes using a technique known as genetic fingerprinting to examine the men's Y chromosome, which is handed down with very little change from father to son. To his surprise, the men all seem to descend from the same ancestor. The men, from 3 English counties, were given DNA kits that included a brush to take a few cells from the inside of their mouths. Half the men tested had a Y chromosome microsatellite fingerprint which showed they had exactly the same Y chromosome. Court records show that the name Sykes first appears about 1300 in West Yorkshire. Brian Sykes said that this will be most valuable to people tracing family histories and that it is astounding news for genealogists. Bruce Coffey said if this DNA test could become readily available and, idealistically, could be run on some of the descendants of the various Oberholtzer lines, it would tell if they all came from a common ancestor in Switzerland or which ones do have a common ancestor. Sykes has patented the test and he thinks they will probably call it OXFORD ANCESTORS. I wonder if John A M Overholt of New Malden, Surrey, England has heard of this. I am sure he would like to round up some Overholts and Oberholtzers in England to take the test.

WOULD YOU BELIEVE THIS?

Many people will believe anything they read but I know our members are too smart to believe the following:

The Obers lived at the foot of the mountain in Switzerland, the Holzers lived half way up the mountainside and the Oberholtzers lived above the timberline.

The Oberholtzers originally were from the area of modern day Israel, having been enslaved in Russia and subsequently escaping to Switzerland and then emigrating to America.

Another "story" is that twenty-six "Overholts" came to Philadelphia between 1690 and 1706 from Germany.

If these aren't fakelore, I would welcome the documentation for them.
