And then come visit us at Terre Hill this August 15th and 16th.

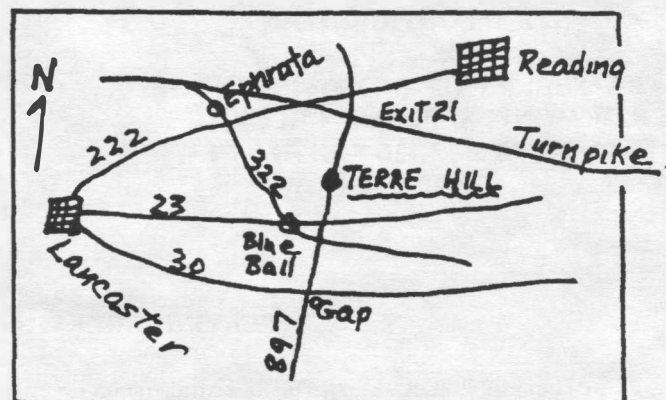

CHRISTOPHER OVERHOLT [MT211]

Christopher Overholt was the son of Isaac Overholt [MT21], of Rainham Twp, Norfolk Co, Ontario, who was a brother of Christopher Overholt [MT24]. Less is known about him than his uncle but two marriages of his daughters has given us a clue as to where he lived.

Jane Overholt 21, of Crowland, Grimsby, d/o Christopher and Amelia Overholt married 4/14/1858 Michael Carey 20, of Merritville, Stamford, s/o John and Mary Carey, by Charles Walker, Baptist Minister of Fonthill.

Joanna Overholt 24, d/o Christopher Overholt married 6/28/1866 Alphonso Elasca White 22.

The 1881 Canadian census shows both couples living in Welland, Welland Co, Ontario.

Alphonso E White, born 10/1/1844 Pelham, had a dry goods and millinery establishment and Joanna, born 10/28/1842, was a milliner. They had a daughter Lillie Vasa Arvilla who was born 1869. The three of them were buried in the Pelham Evangelical Friends Church Cemetery, Pelham Twp, Welland Co.

The children of Michael and Jane Carey, as listed in the 1881 census, were Asenith M born 1866, Earnest O born 1868, T Wilford born 1869 and Welden V born 1873.

Christopher Overholt appears in the records as the oldest of the 5 sons of Isaac and Mary Overholt. Son Jacob would be the next in line and he was born 1801, therefore, Christopher was probably born ca 1799.

CHRISTOPHER OVERHOLT [MT24] CLINTON TWP, LINCOLN COUNTY, ONTARIO, CANADA

Very little is known about Christopher Overholt, son of Staats Overholt, who went to Lincoln County at age 10 with the family in 1786. In the 1828 census Clinton Twp, Lincoln County, Christopher's family consists of 1 male over 16, 3 males under 16, 2 females over 16 and 2 females under 16. In the 1851 census Clinton Twp., Christopher is a widower age 75 living with his son Cornelius age 36, his wife Mary age 25 and their children Rada age 5 and Louisa age 3. Christopher's name does not appear in the 1861 census or other records. He was found on the Muster Roll of Capt Abram Nelles' Flank Company from July 24th to August 24th, 1812 and on the Muster Roll of a Detachment of the 4th Regiment Lincoln Militia commencing October 11th and ending November 1st, 1814.

Christopher Overholt married Anna Lambert, d/o Cornelius. As the daughter of an UEL, she petitioned in 1800 for land that she had never received. She was married at that time and was 15 years old.

Gene Singer of Lahaina, Hawaii found that Christopher was an erstwhile preacher who was accused of brawling and public drunkenness on more than one occasion, each time being dismissed from the Beamsville Baptist Church until he returned repentant.

The 1828 census Clinton Twp. has familiar names. Next to Christopher is Jacob H Fisher who probably was married to Elizabeth Overholt [MT25], sister of Christopher. On the other side of Christopher is Du? Gilmore. Is this the family of Catherine Gilmore who married Mark Overholt, son of Christopher? Also on the list are John Singer the husband of Susannah [MT23], John Singer Jr and Henry Rott [MT26].

MARK OVERHOLT [MT243]
(Note new code for Mark Overholt 1806-1888)

Staats Overholt went to Canada in 1786 with his wife Susannah and, according to all records, his six children. In a petition for a land grant August 12, 1795, Staats gives the names of his 6 children. In his will, which was written June 9, 1804, Staats leaves 26 pounds, 16 shillings to his "beloved son Mark" and to his other three sons, Isaac, Jacob and Christopher, he leaves land. This is the only time that Mark [M127] is seen on any record and it appears that he might be the oldest and possibly wasn't in the area when the will was written. No other trace of him has been found. When the estate of Christian Hunsberger was distributed to the children of Staats ca 1824, the name Mark was never mentioned. For more years than I want to admit, there has been a great debate about Mark Overholt who was found in the Canadian census records. We couldn't understand how he could be born about 22 years after his "youngest sibling" by the same mother. And his death certificate said he was born in 1806. Nothing made sense but we couldn't figure out this puzzle until I had what I call "Another Great Awakening". In among the papers about Mark's family was an article from the Wheatley Journal that said "Isaac Overholt of Amherstburg, formerly of St Catherines, visited with his cousin Alfred Overholt of Blytheswood on July 11, 1918. Isaac is 83 years old and Alfred 81 and they hadn't met for nearly 60 years." Alfred was the son of Mark Overholt (born 1806) and Isaac was the son of Jacob Overholt [MT212]. Isaac and Jacob, sons of Staats, left wills naming their children and they didn't have a son Mark. Christopher, the youngest son of Staats, didn't leave a will and there are children of his that we have not been able to identify. I suddenly realized that this Mark (born 1806) was not the son of Staats but a son of Christopher! In 1852 Christopher Overholt sold 13 acres to Mark Overholt. Quite often fathers sold land to their sons and it was, more or less, in the later years of life when they felt this was a part of their inheritance although the son had to pay something. The mystery is where did the Mark Overholt in the will of Staats live? Was he alive in 1804 when the will was written but died shortly after that? We do know now that the Mark who married Catherine Gilmore was not the son of Staats, but the son of Christopher.

Mark and his wife Catherine appear to have separated because he was alone in the 1871 census and she was probably with one of the children. In looking for Mark in the 1881 census, I found him living with the Nelson Morris family in Louth, Lincoln Co. This was the family of his first cousin once removed Jane Singer and he was listed as being married but no wife was with the family. I was curious as to where his wife Catherine was so my only chance of finding her was to check the 1881 Canadian and 1880 US census for a Catherine who was born ca 1818. The only one who was born around that time was a Catherine, listed as a widow, and living in Bay City, Bay Co, Michigan with William and Lizzie Jane Edwards, who I later found was her daughter.

CONCLUSION: There were two Mark Overholts-one a son of Staats who remains M127 [page 153, THE OBERHOLTZER BOOK] but we remove the "born Canada" and Catherine Gilmore. The other Mark Overholt is the son of Christopher Overholt, son of Staats and he gets the code MT243.

OVERHOLTS AND OBERHOLTZERS IN CANADA

The 1881 Canadian census lists 279 Overholts (this includes heads of households and their families) and 43 Oberholtzers. There are three main Overholt lines-Staats Overholt [MT1] who arrived in 1786, Abraham Overholt [AC] arrived 1787 and Isaac Overholt [IC] ca 1800. Henry Oberholtzer [HJ143] and his brother Joseph [HJ144] arrived ca 1822. Three Oberholtzer brothers went to Canada 1825 and they were Jacob [JF144], Abraham [JF152] and Henry [JF155]. The two sets of brothers came from Montgomery County, PA. In the States, we have about 21 variations of the name Oberholtzer but in Canada I found the only spellings were Overholt and Oberholtzer.

HENRY OVERHOLT [BC1]

The only information I had about Henry Overholt was that he was born 1827 in Markham, Ontario, the son of Benjamin Oberholser and Elizabeth Miller, and that he married Eliza who died 11/7/1857. Then I found that her maiden name was Bearss. I was trying to sort out the Henry Overholts in Ontario and I found one that was born in 1827 and he was in the 1881 census in Burford, Brant Co. South with a wife Margaret and sons William and John. I then looked up the Henry Overholts in the Ontario Cemetery Finding Aid and found that there was one in North Bay Union Cemetery, Widdifield, Nipissing Co. Ontario. I was lucky enough to find the 1901 census for Nipissing Co. and I found Henry and his wife living with son John and his family. Son William, who was single, was also living with them. They were all listed in the North Bay Union Cemetery. In checking further in the RootsWeb, I found a Homepage with more information about Henry Overholt. It said that he had married Eliza Bearss with no second marriage mentioned. The cemetery listing I found didn't give dates but it did say that Henry's wife was Margaret Wright and that their son John had married Jerusha A Kinsella. I love puzzles and this certainly shows that the problem was finally solved piece by piece.

THE 1880 CENSUS

In going over the 1880 Iowa census on the Internet for Oberholtzers in Pottawattamie County, I found Henry Oberholtzer born PA, father born Scot and mother born Eng. The person transcribing from the original census certainly got mixed up because Henry is a 5th generation Oberholtzer, SL2463 in THE OBERHOLTZER BOOK, and the great great grandson of 1727 immigrant Samuel Oberholtzer of Lancaster County PA. Also listed as his sons are Pat Clyant 21 born Eng, George Clemant 35 born PA, Wm Scott 15 born IA and John Scott 13 born IA. Some years ago, I did the original census and these "sons" were not listed. Henry's children were Wilson Jacob, Anna Lizzie, Clarence Monroe and Ida Mary Oberholtzer, all born in Iowa.

JACOB OVERHOLT [BC2]

Jacob Overholt, son of Benjamin Oberholser, has not been traced but I feel I have found him in the United States. His father settled in Markham, York Co, Ontario where Jacob was born c1834. The children of Benjamin scattered with Abraham and Benjamin coming back to the USA. The 1870 census Ohio, Medina Co, Wadsworth Twp. shows a Jacob Overholt 36 born Canada, wife Mary Ann 34 b Ohio, Samuel 11 b Canada, Elizabeth 9 b Canada, Ida 5 b Ohio and Harvey 1 b Ohio. The 1880 census Ohio, Cuyahoga County, Cleveland, has Jacob P Overholt 46 (with his parents born in Pennsylvania.), Mary 44, Webster 21, Lizzie 19, Ida 15, Harvey 12 and Mary 9. Benjamin Oberholser and both wives were born in Pennsylvania. The middle initial "P" is an important clue because, when Benjamin married Mary Schmair in 1834, the witnesses were Jacob Pingle and his wife Catherine. Abraham Overholt [BC4], born 1837, and also the son of Benjamin, is found in Iowa 1880 and he said he was born in Canada and his parents were born in Pennsylvania. Another brother, Benjamin Overholt [BC7], born 1845, was found in Nebraska in 1880 and he said he was born in Canada and his parents in Pennsylvania. I feel that this Jacob was a brother of Abraham and Benjamin Overholt. I have not found another Jacob Overholt, born in Canada in that time period, who had both parents born in Pennsylvania and that is the most important clue.

I have run across various spellings for the name Overholt in the census. I failed to find two Overholts who I knew were in the 1880 US and 1881 Canadian census and since I had an idea about where they lived, I went through the census page by page and I finally found them. Alfred Overholt was under Overbolt and George H Overholt was under Overholl. My great grandfather Christian Overholt was under Oberholt. I also found a Samuel Bricker who married Catherine Overholt. Her name was spelled Overuet and Overult. No one ever said that researching was easy!

IS JOHN WRONG RIGHT?

The 1881 Canadian census asks the ethnic origin of each person and the answers were always German, English or Irish, etc. John Wrong of Lincoln County put his origin as "Indigenous".

CHILD LABOR

The 1881 Canadian census shows William Hanger age 4, occupation: laborer. He is "working" at the home of Philip Overholt in Louth, Lincoln Co. ONT. They must not have had the child labor laws back then.

MORE THAN FOUR GRANDPARENTS

In 1948, Dean Overholser, son of Mr & Mrs Lora Overholser of Carroll Co, Indiana, is said to have 14 grandparents. Through divorce and remarriage, he had 10 real flesh and blood grandparents and 4 by marriage. To explain it would only confuse me more than I am at this time.

PET PEEVE #2
