When Government Documents are wrong.

MV Mark Overholt from Ireland O Line

The people of any country trust there government to at least not lie to them. That seamingly small and overlooked fact is the foundation for all civility. So when a geneologist, or just a family member, is searching legal documents which are stored by the government, they take the written information as gospel. And so it should be, *for the most part*.

Barbara Ford acquired the death certificates for some of the MV family before she passed away. They have not been looked at since 2009, as there is so much information to go through. Jan Williams of Hawaii wrote to me after the August 2008 Bulletin was released. She mentioned that George W Overholt's death certificate did not mention that he came from Ireland. She had sent along a copy of it, but it was only the upper portion of the certificate. Below is the full copy:

Mrs Lee R Overholt was the one who gave the information on George's parents. Lee R Overholt is the son of George W. Mrs Lee R Overholt's maiden name was Lydia R Galford. The date of George's birth in 1833 matches the genealogy records. But George's father, George William Overholt was born June 15, 1795 in Rockingham Co VA, and not Ireland as stated on the death certificate. Mrs Lee R Overholt had made a mistake in the generations when giving that info.

There was another mistake in the death certificates of this family. William H Overholt, youngest son of George William Overholt was born in 1841. His death certificate was signed by Mrs E W Hale of Princeton W. VA. Mrs Hale is MV404 Emma Gertrude Overholt, daughter of William H Overholt. She gave William's mother as Mary Stephens, which was correct. But she gave the father's name as Mark Overholt, which is his grandfather.

It seems rather odd that Emma married a lawyer, and yet made such a mistake. Yet we must remember that back in the early years of the United States, unlike today, families did most of their communications verbally. It is easy to mix spoken information, and here we have two examples from the same family.

MV Marcus Oberholtzer b c1760 was first found on the 1787 tax list in Rockingham Co VA. It has been suggested that he had a 1st marriage with a son Martin b c 1782-no further information.

Marcus came to America by way of Ireland, confirmed in death certificate of grandson George W Overholt.

When searching for old documents, we need to remember -----the government did not make the mistake(s). The government does not have the time or
resources to proof read everything they are told. They expect the person giving information to
state the truth. Besides it is against the law to mislead the government. In a situation like this,
we need to put away the judicial accusations, and work out a reasonable conclusion to what has

In this situation with the George Overholt family, the wives were going by what they heard being said many years before. Did they misunderstand from the beginning? Or did time miscue the facts, and she overlaid a generation? There are no concrete answers to such questions. But it is most probable that the information is correct to the degree that Marcus Overholt had come from Ireland.

An Encouraging Report from Italy

Testimony gathered by Gianni Giardinelli, translated by Giuseppe Pellegrino Permission by Pastor Wane Lawton, OFA member


A 38 year old atheist physician in Lombardy Italy is seeing God in all the darkness and chaos there: "Never in my darkest nightmares did I imagine that I would have seen and lived through what has been happening here in our hospital for the last three weeks. And the nightmare only grows; the river becomes bigger and bigger. At the beginning only a few arrived, then dozens, and then hundreds, and now we are no longer doctors, we have become mere sorters who decide who should live and who must be sent home to die; even if they are people who have paid Italian taxes for their whole life."

"Up until 2 weeks ago, my colleagues and I were atheists. This was normal because we are doctors and we have learned that science proves that God does not exist. I always laughed at my parents when they went to church. Nine days ago, a 75 year old pastor came to us for medical help. He was a kind man, he had grave respiratory problems, but he had a Bible with him and it impressed us that he was reading the Bible to the people who were dying and holding their hands. We were all tired, discouraged doctors, psychologically and physically spent, and so we found that we were listening to him."

"Now we must admit: as human beings we have reached our limits, there is nothing more we can do, and more people are dying every single day. And we are exhausted. Two of our colleagues have died and others are infected. We realized that we have reached the limits of what man can do. We need God, and we have begun to ask for his help, when we have a few moments free. We speak among ourselves and we cannot believe that we who were fierce atheists are now seeking for interior peace by asking the Lord to help us resist so that we can take care of the sick."

"Yesterday the 75 year old pastor died. Despite the fact that in the last three weeks we have had over 120 people die in our unit and we are all exhausted and feel destroyed, he succeeded, despite his own condition and our own difficulties, to bring us a PEACE that we no longer hoped to find. The paster went to the Lord, and soon we will follow him if things continue like this. I have not been home for six days; I don't know the last time I ate something; I realize my own worthlessness on this Earth, and I want to dedicate my last breath to helping others. I'm happy to return to God while I am surrounded by the suffering and death of my fellow men."

Remember Life is Short, and a Higher Power is there for You!



Cousin Noah Oberholtzer Jr and I went cemetery hunting for two years back in the Ots. One Saturday, we made our way west to the village of Conestoga on the east side of the Susquehanna River. On the south side of the village is the Conestoga Mennonite Church and Cemetery. That is where the normal left.

There were three stone markers made of slate. That did not surprise me, for I knew Italian slate cutters had worked in the quarry along the river in the mid 18th Century. As we attempted to read the stone, the name Ester Harnischin caught my attention. I descend from the Harnish family in that area, who settled there in 1718, and had a liquor license since 1726 (Chester County Records), and one from Lancaster County in 1728. They sold rum to the Native Americans from Indiantown in the basement of their home, which now resides with the Conestoga Historical Society. Here are translations of the stone.

The literal translation:

Year 1786 the 16 of December Ester Harnischin died and her age is 27 years and 1 month and 2 weeks.

The idiomatic translation:

On December 16, 1786, Ester Harnischin died, and her age was 27 years, 1 month, and 2 days.

Seems uncomplicated. But the stone reads much more difficult. The word *Anno* is Latin. Also, *IHR and IAHR* both stand for the word year (Jahr in German), but begins with an I, which is Latin. *Wochen* is German, but not spelled the normal way. Ester is not our English spelling of Esther, and Harnischin has the Reformation style suffix -*in* which denotes the person to be female.


Another anomaly is that the stone reads like the ancient Mideast scripts. Words are not completed at the end of the line, and just continue on the next line. There are dots too separate the words, which did not occur in the ancient writings.

So what we have here is an Italian stonecutter enscribing German with an English alphabet!

Harnish Woods in Canton of Zurich, Switzerland

The grove of trees *oberhalb Klein Baterswil* was the homestead of the Harnish family. In 1541 the place is listed in German as *Heisst 1541 Harnatzholz*, and in 1788 as *Hornetsholz*. *It was the wooded place where the hornets lived*.

JL Jacob Oberholtzer died in 1755, so she could not be his daughter. She would not be d/o JL2 Samuel, for Sam was not married till 1765, unless he had another wife. Sarah would not be d/o JL3, who stayed in Lancaster County PA. JL4 Christian is mysteriously 19 yrs older than his wife. Are we missing a generation?

This Sarah is the d/o Isaac Overholt who was in Frederick Co MD before going to CANADA. IC8 Sarah Overholt m Rudolph Swartz

Since Sarah is married, she would not have retained the surname Overholt. So this is a different Sarah than Sarah G Overholtzer.

JBsr5. Henry Oberholtzer est 1745, or later if a change of life baby -- referred to by JB6 This Henry may possibly be the father of HA Henry. But there is no evidence at this time.

This Henry cannot be from the JA Line, for JA1 Abraham is a brother of Henry in Ab's will. If JAsr had another son, he would have been at least in his 50's at Henry's birth. But because JA6 Samuel became guardian of the children of CAS Christian Overholser who died 1819, the two families must have been close, and they both did live in Reading Twp. Adams Co.

This still leaves the question open for the connection to Sarah G Overholtzer and HA Henry.

Since the finding of a missing Christian Overholser generation, this leaves the possibility that HA and CA are related, and that Sarah G is related. And is Sarah G a Garber?

The New OS European Line is now on the Website!

All available records of Oberholz descendants from the 1500's to the 1900's in Europe have been tabulated and corrected from past records. This line is coded as the OS (**O**berholz in Switzerland) Line on our website. American Lines which can connect to the European Line have Barbara Ford's coding system in brackets after the OS code number. This reduces confusion for those who are familiar with the present coding system, and yet allows a person to continue their line backwards to the first known Oberholzer, that of Farmer Oberholzer from 1438 CE.
