As I write this the year is drawing to a close but I want to reflect back on the reunion held in August at Terre Hill by saying that I was pleased with this year's reunion. We had a good number who attended and there was a wide spectrum of lines represented, i.e., many were from various branches of immigrant Samuel Oberholtzer (1727) and many from other lines of the Oberholtzers, Overholts, etc. In the light of this it appears to me that there is a bright prospect for many reunions in the future.

THE SIXTH ANNUAL O.F.A. REUNION, 1911

The sixth annual reunion of the Overholser Family was held in Williamson Park, Aug. 3, 1911.

The attendance was not as large as the year previous owing probably largely to threatening weather in the morning and heavy rain during the previous night.

The program of exercises consisted of songs, the report of the Historian, the Rev. Thomas Krick, and of the Memorial Committee by S. S. Watts. Responses to the Symposium on Jacob Overholser by Mrs. Sue Haines, his daughter, Isaac Stirk, W. H. H. Kinzer, the Rev. J. S. Overholser, the Rev. Thomas Krick, and E. L. Watts.

A solo was rendered by the Rev. J. S. Over-holser.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: President--Martin L. Over-holser, Secretary--Miss Anna Overholser, and Treasurer--J. L. W. Weiler.

Committee of Arrangements: S. O. Frantz, J. L. W. Weiler, E. L. Watts, Jno. N. Beam, and C. E. Barr.

Terre Hill was selected as the place for the next Reunion and the time was left to the Committee of Arrangements.

On motion the present system of serving the dinner was continued, the President to appoint a local committee of Terre Hill folk to attend to arrangements for the dinner. Later the first Thursday in August was selected for the next Reunion.

Closed with the singing of "Sweet Bye and Bye" and benediction by the Rev. J. S. Overholser.

GENEALOGICAL QUERY

My great-great-grandmother, Christina Oberholtzer, was born July 23, 1798, and died Jan. 3, 1840, and is buried in the private Burkholder Cemetery (now in Letterkenny Army Depot) near Pleasant Hall, Franklin County, Pa., along with her husband, Christian Huber, my great-great-grandfather, born Jan. 9, 1793, died Aug. 12, 1867.

I believe that Christina's father was Christian Oberholtzer of Bethel Township, Lebanon County, Pa., born Feb. 24, 1766, died Mar. 23, 1834, whose wife was Christina Funk, born Dec. 15, 1768, died Mar. 26, 1854. I have a copy of the will of this Christian Oberholtzer dated Feb. 28, 1834, probated Apr. 14, 1834, Lebanon County, Will Book 0-4, which names among his children "Christina the wife of Christian Huber". This seems to definitely establish my line, but I am uncertain from this point backward.

Where can I find documentation identifying the father of Christian Oberholtzer of Bethel Township, Lebanon County, Pa.?

DR. MILTON PLEAM OVERHOLSER, WELL-KNOWN MISSOURI PHYSICIAN

One of the best-known physicians in midwestern medical circles, Dr. Milton P. Overholser was descendant of III Martin, IV Isaac and V Levi. He practiced for 5 years in Kansas followed by 43 years in Harrisonville, Mo. While in Harrisonville, he was appointed twice as superintendent of state hospitals in Nevada, Mo. and St. Joseph, Mo.

In 1934, he was honored by the Cass County Medical Society on his 50th anniversary as a medical practitioner. He died in 1937, one day before his 78th birthday.

He was born June 19, 1859 on a farm in Will County, Ill. mear what is now Downer's Grove, a suburb of Chicago, the son of Levi and Maria Pleam Overholser. When he was 6, the family moved to Lancaster County, Pa. where he completed elementary and high school. Between terms he worked at his father's woolen mill at Safe Harbor, Pa.

After high school, he taught school in Lancaster County, Pa. for a year until, at age 19, he moved with his family to a farm in Russell County, Kans. where he resumed his teaching as well as in Jackson County, Mo. to earn enough to go through medical school. He graduated with an M.D. from Kansas City

OLDEST LIVING DESCENDANT?

We salute Mrs. Bernice Oberholser Layton of Bull Shoals, Arkansas, who celebrated her 90th birthday June 4, 1981. We believe that Bernice is the oldest living descendant of our common ancestor, Samuel Oberholtzer. Bernice is the great-granddaughter of IV Christian. Medical College in 1884 and practiced for 5 years in Simpson, Kans. before starting his long practice in Harrisonville.

His first wife was Fannie E. Long, mother of his two sons, who died Mar. 3, 1919. Two years later (Aug. 27, 1921) he married Leila R. Britt who survived him.

Like their father, Dr. Overholser's sons achieved distinguished professional careers. Dr. Earle L. Overholser was Chairman of the Dept. of Horticulture at Washington State College, Pullman, Wash. Dr. Milton D. Overholser was head of the Dept. of Anatomy in the School of Medicine of the University of Missouri--Columbia and retired as Professor Emeritus in 1969. He is a well-known amateur magician and performed the two times he attended O.F.A. Reunions.

Dr. Overholser was survived by four grand-children: Earle L. Overholser, Jr. (now of Montgomery, Ala.) and Grace Ann Overholser, children of Dr. Earle; and Elise and Milton Denis Overholser, children of Dr. Milton D. Overholser. Two brothers also survived him: I. F. Overholser, Hays, Kans. and Jesse Overholser, Russell, Kans.

Because of the intricacies of the office, he was retained through several changes in the factional and political leadership of the House.

71ST REUNION PRONOUNCED UNQUALIFIED SUCCESS!

Eighty-two people congregated in the basement meeting room of the Terre Hill Fire Hall on Saturday, Aug. 22, 1981, for the 71st Overholser Family Association Reunion. This was not as many as attended the 1980 Reunion (98) but considerably more than that of 1979 (52). Spencer Overholser's genealogical charts lined one whole wall of the room and several large tables in the front were loaded with a wide variety of covered and uncovered dishes of delicious food, to which the assembled crowd soon did justice.

At the appropriate time, as he has done for the last 25 Reunions, President Spencer Overholser opened the meeting. His voice carried easily throughout the room, assisted by an ingenious wireless microphone supplied by Dan Pettigrew, which later was passed around the room as each one present introduced himself and gave his genealogical background, thus helping us all to know each other better.

Treasurer Marjorie Carroll's report showed an increase in our treasury from \$96.29 last year to \$135.64. The collection from the group yielded \$216.00.

Facilities Committee Chairman Richard Stevens reported on several other potential meeting places such as the Martindale Fire Hall, Long's Park, Lititz Spring Park, and Ephrata Community Park. After discussion, it was decided to again hold the 1982 Reunion at Terre Hill Fire Hall. The date: Aug. 28.

Jim Kehew, Camp Hill, Pa. was voted Editor of the BULLETIN, succeeding Robert M. Oberholser who had served during 1981. Dr. Daythal Kendall, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, presented as a slate of officers for 1981-82 the 9 present officers, who were unanimously reelected. President Spencer indicated that after 25 years in the chair, he was willing to step down if someone else were willing to accept the position.

To liven things up a bit, Ruth Overholser led the group in the Overholser Reunion Song -- all four verses. Written to the tune of "Rally Round the Flag", it was first sung at the 1919 Reunion.

Prizes were awarded to the oldest person present (Robert M. Oberholser, Freehold, N.J., 89), the youngest (Charlie Kendall, son of Daythal and Carolyn of Glenside, Pa., 3), the one who had traveled the farthest (Glen Brandvold, Albuquerque, N.M.), and the couple married the longest (John and Martha Oberholtzer, Manheim, Pa., 52 years).

After adjournment, the group assembled outside the hall for picture taking by Dan Pettigrew. Another successful O.F.A. Reunion thus entered the history books. Hope to see you next year!
