Time once again to meet together at our 78th Annual Reunion in the fire hall in the Lancaster County village of Terre Hill, PA. (See map below.)





REMINDER -- The 1985 reprint of the Rev. A. J. Fretz's OBERHOLTZER & NASH FAMILY HISTORIES, originally published in 1903, is available from the Westmoreland-Fayette Historical Society, West Overton, Scottdale, PA 15683, for \$20 plus \$2.00 postage and handling. (Pa. residents include \$1.20 sales tax.) It is a genealogical record of the descendants of Martin Oberholtzer (1709-1744). Recently I received a letter from Sharon Taylor of Halbert's, Inc. of Bath, Ohio offering me The New World Kehew Family Album and Complete Registry for \$24.50, 30% off the regular price of \$34.95. I almost feel like I know Sharon. She and similar publishers like Beatrice Bayley have been written up in many genealogical publications. They are usually the subject of items warning their readers to beware of misrepresentation and other charges brought by various watchdog agencies such as the U.S. Postal Service and Better Business Bureaus.

What Sharon's company says it has done is go through lists of over 100 million surnames "using an International Network of computer sources in Europe, Canada, the U.S. and Australia" to find out how many Kehews they could come up with. Now Kehew isn't exactly what you'd call a household name and in fact it's hard to find in phone books and other sources (I've tried). After spending "thousands of dollars", Sharon says she has located "almost every Kehew family in the New World" and not surprisingly they number less than one in every million of those 100 million people.

Besides the list of Kehews (males only, I assume, not female Kehews who have married), the Kehew Family Album will tell how and why my forebears immigrated to the U.S., the role of heraldry during the Kehew family's medieval period, how I can trace my family tree, and even participate in a heritage tour back to the Kehew homeland. This "first edition" (and presumably last) is "virtually handmade to order", will be serially numbered, registered in my name and accompanied by a Certificate of Authenticity. Furthermore, if I am dissatisfied with it, I may return it within 30 days for "an immediate and unquestioned refund". Nowhere does Sharon say the Album is a history of the Kehew family nor does it purport to show familial relationships among the Kehews listed.

So for \$26.38 (including shipping and handling), I can get a list of names and addresses of Kehews "in the New World" to whom I might write to see if there are familial relationships among us. And with a name as rare as this, how can I miss turning up a few cousins! (Actually, it is costing only \$13.19 as my brother is going in this with me.)

What would it cost me to do this myself? One writer (her name is DeWolf) asked a major mailing list firm this very question about her name and they said about \$10,000. What runs the cost up, they said, was not the number of DeWolfs but the time it takes the computers to go through the 65 million names in their files to find them. So if all we want is a list of almost 100 Kehews to whom we can write, someone might say Sharon is offering my brother and me a bargain. Anyone else receiving "A Letter from Sharon" (or Beatrice or any of the others who provide this service) should consider carefully what they are and are not getting for their money and act accordingly.

NOTICE

The duties of the Necrologist are to keep and publish an accurate, continuous record of births, deaths, and marriages of Association members and their families. (It is published annually in the BULLETIN.) This is a tall order for one person to accomplish alone. In fact, it's impossible. He cannot possibly know of such events without our notifying him of them. It is so easy to forget. When something like this happens, we are usually so involved emotionally that the last thing that crosses our mind is making sure it is recorded. DESCENDANTS OF MARX OBERHOLTZER AND HIS SON MARCUS (1664-1725)

About 60% of our membership is descended from Immigrant Samuel Oberholtzer who emigrated in 1727. A growing group of members trace their ancestry to Marx Oberholtzer (-1708?) and his son, Marcus Oberholtzer (1664-1725) of Chester and Bucks Counties in Pennsylvania. (There are quite a few members whose ancestry we do not know.) To fill in the gaps in this line and to allow other members to identify with it, it is being published in the BULLETIN. The data came from those listed below, to whom we extend deep thanks.

There are many gaps in the information (especially dates) and no doubt errors. We would like to make it as accurate and complete as possible and ask that if you can supply more or better information, please do so by sending it to the Editor. When the chart is as complete as we can make it, copies will be made available at cost to members of the Association who request them.

We trust that the method of listing by generations used here is clear. However, we are not wedded to this format. If anyone can suggest a better one, we would be glad to consider it.

We have received an interesting item from member SPENCER TINKER of Honolulu. Hawaii. It is a list of papers and monographs on birds from a bookseller in Tucson, Ariz. Included in the 8-page list are 14 papers by an H. C. OBERHOLSER. They range in size from 13 to 137 pages and are dated from 1900 to 1932. They are notes and lists of birds from all over the world, including South America, Asia, and Africa as well as the U.S. According to Spencer, he is the only Overholser scientist to break into print in over 40 years.
